
ESG Criteria

Environmental criteria address how a company deals with the environment, green initiatives and clean technology. Social criteria consider how a company manages employees, treats customers and interacts with the community. Corporate governance criteria look at a company's ethics and leadership practices. Socially responsible investments are assessed on these three types of ESG factors.
